DISCUSSION LEADERS

Professor Wilson Schmidt, Chairman (USA)

Visiting Professor in Economics at the Bologna Center, Professor Schmidt will return to his position as Professor of Economics at George Washington University at the end of this academic year. He is the author of *International Trade, Investment and Commercial Policy*, 1st-3rd editions (1958), and co-author of *International Economics* (1957) and *The Rescue of the Dollar* (1963). He is also a member of the Board of Editors of the Southern Economic Journal.

Professor Jean-Baptiste Duroselle (France)

Head of the Fulbright Commission for France and holder of the Chair of International Relations at the Sorbonne, Professor Duroselle is one of Europe's outstanding scholars. He was Visiting Professor in International Relations at the Bologna Center from 1955-1964. Among his many publications are *Les débuts du Catholicisme social en France, Histoire diplomatique de 1919 à nos jours*, and *De Wilson à Roosevelt*.

Professor Altiero Spinelli (Italy)

Professor Spinelli is the Center's Visiting Professor of Politics. He is a member of the Central Committee of the Mouvement Fédéraliste Européen, of the Centro Studi of the Fondazione Adriano Olivetti, and a member of the editorial board of *Il Mulino*. Professor Spinelli is the author of *Dagli stati sovrani agli stati uniti d'Europa, Manifesto dei federalisti Europei*, and *L'Europa non cade dal cielo*.

Professor Reimut Jochimsen (Germany)

Professor of Economics at the University of Kiel, Professor Jochimsen is a former student of the Bologna Center. He attended the Universities of Bonn, Harvard and Freiburg, where he was a member of the Law and Economics Faculty until late 1964. He is the author of *Anstanzpunkte der Wohlstands-oekonomik* and of many articles in scientific periodicals.

Sir Eric Roll (Great Britain)

Permanent Undersecretary of State of the Department of Economic Affairs, Sir Eric Roll was formerly the Economic Minister and Head of the U. K. Treasury Delegation in Washington. He also has held the position of Executive Director for the U. K. International Monetary Fund and International Bank for Reconstruction and Development. He was the U. K. Deputy Leader for the negotiations with the EEC. His *History of Economic Thought* and his *Elements of Economic Theory* are two of the most important contributions in the field of economics.

Ambassador Henrik N. Boon (The Netherlands)

Ambassador Boon is presently the representative of the Netherlands at the OECD and at NATO, following a distinguished career in the foreign service of his country. He has served as Secretary-General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ambassador to Italy, and Ambassador to Venezuela.

Professor Robert Neumann (USA)

Presently Director of the Institute for International and Foreign Studies of the University of California at Los Angeles, Professor Neumann has been a member of the Department of Political Science of the University of California since 1947. He has lectured in Vienna, Munich, Madrid, Paris, Brussels, Bordeaux and Strasbourg, and has published numerous articles on international affairs.
