Upon completing my work with the Danish Refugee Council, I have interned for the Delegation of the European Union to Ethiopia in order to understand their solutions to the causes of the migration crisis that was originating from Ethiopia and the Horn of Africa at large. My main task at the EU delegation was mapping and analyzing EU's policies and projects in regards to migration and development that correspond to the 5 priority domains of the Valletta Summit.

In addition to this, I am also learning French and Arabic.
